Spotted Wing Drosophila (SWD)

The Spotted Wing
Drosophila has been
found in and around Lane
County in early April.
That is a lot of SWD
sightings so early in the
growing season, which
means that we may get
hammered with the insect in most berry crops
this year - strawberries,
raspberries, blueberries,
cherries, peaches, and
blackberries.

The SWD attacks soft fruit, such as blackberries, blueberries, raspberries, strawberries, cherries, and peaches. Trapping this new critter is very important, so get a few monitoring traps out (see website for trap design). I found that the SWD was quite wide spread last year, so be aware. If it gets really bad, the worst case scenario is that we will get protein with the carbs from the berries.
